

FROM THE DIRECTOR

Take a voyage of creativity at Grafton Regional Gallery this season.

This winter we invite you to journey through the awe-inspiring *Inlandsee* exhibition, which explores undercurrents in contemporary art. This exhibition features 26 artistic voices from across NSW and delves into contemporary practice in all its forms. Bring the family along to take part in a creative adventure with *Inlandseekers*, an interactive and collaborative exhibition designed for our young artists and produced by artist Claudie Frock

September brings a celebration of contemporary drawing with the launch of the 2022 Jacaranda Acquisitive Drawing Award – JADA. This year the prize has been expanded to include a \$3,500 emerging award, alongside the \$35,000 major prize. The judge for this year is Suzanne Cotter, the recently appointed Director at the Museum of Contemporary Arts, Sydney. Alongside JADA we are excited to be presenting a solo exhibition of new work by the 2020 JADA winner Teo Trelor.

Throughout spring the *Festival of Local Schools* will brighten up the courtyard with a number of collaborative banners featuring artwork by local school students. Keep an eye out on our monthly French Door Gallery program which features local artists on view in Prentice House.

The Gallery team extends support to our artist neighbours from the Northern Rivers, as they continue their journey of recovery from the floods. As part of this support the Gallery will be hosting a series of exhibition projects in collaboration with Lismore Regional Gallery during Spring.

Summer will be dazzling at the Gallery with inspiration for all ages including, the sensational 2022 *Archibald Prize*, the delightful *Younge Archie* featuring portraits by young people, *Art Class HSC* artworks from local art students, and our annual end of year celebratory *Summer Sensations* exhibition featuring works from our creative Clarence artists.







LISMORE REGIONAL GALLERY POP-UP

To support our neighbours in the Northern Rivers, Grafton Regional Gallery is hosting a pop up exhibition from Lismore Regional Gallery while their gallery is rebuilt after the recent flooding disaster. In the coming months the Gallery will continue to look for more opportunities for artists from the Northern Rivers.

RE-COLLECT

LYNDALL PHELPS

Collecting, nature and history are recurring themes within Phelps' art practice. *Re-collect* explores two key areas, firstly the little-known role played by women, in an amateur capacity, in the collecting of botanical specimens in nineteenth century Australia, and secondly, the fragility and vulnerability of the natural world. From 1870 to 1895 seven women from northern New South Wales played an important role by contributing specimens to Australia's first herbarium, now the National Herbarium of Victoria. Miss Brundoch, Miss Annie Murray, Miss Edith Thornton, and Mrs Mary Wilcox collected in the Clarence district whilst Miss Annie Edwards, Mrs Mary Hodgkinson and her daughter Miss Virginia Hodgkinson collected in the Richmond Valley.

Phelps has compiled a list of the 700 plus specimens collected by these women. These have become the starting point for *Re-collect*, an installation combining drawings, embroideries, sculptures, and botanical specimens. Alongside her historical research, Phelps is collaborating with Peter Mouatt and Heidi Lunn at the Southern Cross Plant Science Herbarium, viewing and photographing specimens with their dissecting and compound microscopes, allowing her to observe specimens in ways that were unimaginable to the female collectors. She is also, with the expertise of Peter Gould, collecting specimens at the Lismore Rainforest Botanic Gardens, where there are over 100 species collected by the women.





YOUNG ARCHIE COMPETITION REGIONAL TOUR

The portrait should be of a person who is special to you - someone who is known to you and plays a significant role in your life.

There are four age categories:

- 16-18 year olds

The competition will be judged based on merit and originality. At least five finalists from each category will be exhibited at the Gallery and on the Gallery website. One winner will be chosen in each category. Each winner will receive prizes provided by ANZ.

HOW TO ENTER:

- Download, print and complete the entry form, which includes a brief statement (less than 100 words) telling us who you have chosen to depict and why. This form must be signed by a parent or legal guardian.
- Your artwork should be sent flat, not folded or rolled. We suggest you place it between two pieces of cardboard to protect it.
- If you wish your artwork returned after the competition, please also enclose a stamped, self-addressed envelope of the correct size. Families submitting artwork for more than one child must enclose one envelope per artwork due to the way that entries are processed.






